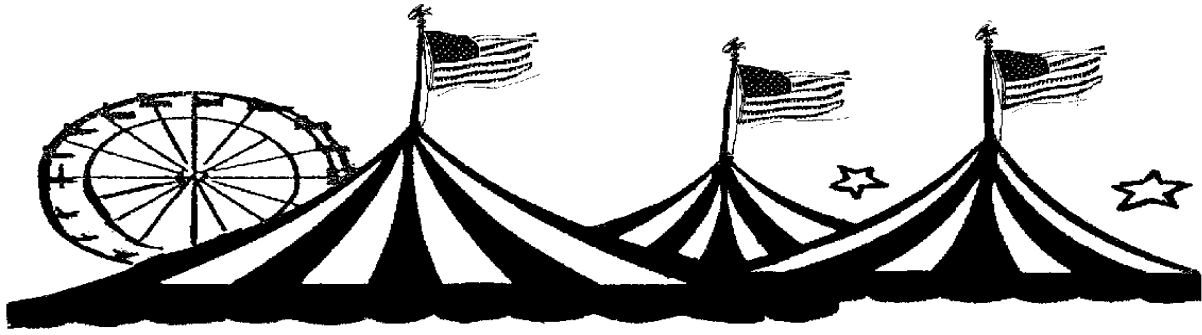

CLASSES – 4-H, FCCLA, & OPEN

ATTENTION

All entries, except for Livestock, will be accepted for judging. This includes all open class, FCCLA, 4-H and FFA entries (including baked goods, horticulture, field crops, Farm Mechanics, etc.)

All 4-H categories have been included in the general listing of categories.

1. All exhibits must have been made since the **2024** Stoddard County Fair.
2. **Persons may enter only two (2) exhibits per entry number and they must not both be the same. (Example-two entries of chocolate chip cookies are not allowed).**
3. Exhibits **must** be entered in the name of the person who made them.
4. The Fair Book Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.
5. **All youth exhibitors must show age on entry tag.**
6. **EXHIBIT TAGS MUST BE COMPLETED IN FULL TO RECEIVE PREMIUM MONIES.**
7. **Open classes are open to the State of Missouri. 4-H, FCCLA, and FFA classes are open to members who live in Stoddard County or are members of a Stoddard County 4-H Club, FCCLA and FFA.**
8. **The Stoddard County Fair will not be responsible for any damaged, lost, or stolen items.**
9. **All 4-H, FFA & FCCLA premium monies will be mailed to club leaders. All OPEN CLASS premium monies \$20.00 & less must be picked up at the Fair Office on Sunday, Sep. 21 between Noon and 4 PM (over \$20 will be mailed by check to participants). ALL EXHIBITS NOT PICKED UP BY 4 PM SUNDAY, WILL RESULT IN NO PREMIUM BEING PAID OUT FOR THAT ITEM. ALL LIVESTOCK & EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN ON DISPLAY UNTIL SUNDAY MORNING OF THE CURRENT FAIR YEAR FOR EXHIBITS TO RECEIVE PREMIUM MONIES.**

CLOVER KID PROGRAM

1. No wildlife allowed.
2. All animals must be caged, leashed and/or contained as appropriate and manageable by the child during the 4-H Clover Kids meetings and events.
3. Parent or guardian must be present with his or her child(ren) when animals are involved.
4. Clover Kid exhibits are not judged and will receive a green ribbon at the Fair.
5. National, State and County **Approved Small Animals** for Clover Kids to exhibit are:

Amphibians - (toads, frogs); Birds; Cavies (guinea pigs, gerbils, hamsters); Cats, Chinchillas, Dogs, Fish, Hedgehogs, Lizards & Snakes (non-venomous), Mice, Rats, & rabbits.
6. Clover Kid members may only exhibit animals approved in the publicized list in the 4-H.
7. Clover Kid members **MAY NOT** exhibit or Sell in **LARGE** livestock category.

Limit of 10 items per person.

1. Only **Standard mason-type**, clear-glass jar with standard lids will be accepted.
2. All jars must be sealed and processed.
3. Bands should be left on jars when using (two pieces).
4. Date processed: month and year must be on entry tag.
5. Signs of spoilage will disqualify exhibit.
6. Exhibitors must be **8 & older**, Pressure Canning **must be 14 and older**.
